


## **Teachers Feedback Report 2020-21**














































The different aspects of feedback for the teachers can be broadly classified as feedback on (i) curriculum, (ii) infrastructure, and (iii) issues related to the administration, work culture and career advancement in the college. As per the responses received, in the first category teachers are more or less satisfied with the course content. It is found that most of the teachers (almost 92%) have agreed that (i) the curriculum have enough flexibility, (ii) the course content fulfils the need of students, (iii) syllabus is suitable to the course, (iv) aims and objectives of the syllabi are well defined and clear to teachers and students, (v) course content is followed by corresponding reference materials, (vi) the course/programme of studies carries sufficient number of optional papers, (vii) conducting examinations well in time with proper coverage of all units in the curriculum, (viii) the books prescribed/listed as reference materials are relevant, updated and appropriate.

Regarding the infrastructure, 84% teachers have stated that sufficient number of prescribed books is available in the Library. Also nearly 82% of teachers have agreed that the college has good infrastructural facilities, (i.e. having sufficient teacher's rooms, class rooms, reading rooms, laboratory, rest rooms and toilets).

The statistic based on teachers' feedback regarding the third aspect is also quite impressive. Most of the teachers (88%) agreed to the following parameters, like, (i) authorities are approachable and accessible, (ii) the environment in the department/College is conducive to teaching and research, (iii) there is a mechanism for feedback, review and performance enhancement for the teaching staff, (iv) provisions for professional development are non-discriminatory and fair, (v) recognition of the individual work is given, and (vi) freedom to adopt new innovation/techniques of teaching. Lastly, teachers have commented that increasing the number and variety of books, more computer labs, and modernisation of laboratories can further uplift the status of this institute and foster the teaching-learning outcome.
